This project will consist of: a primary surveillance radar, secondary surveillance radar, VHF air to ground communication equipment, AMHS, AWOS, VCSS, Air Traffic Management (ATM) software and simulation consoles. Once installed at the J.A. Pengel International Airport and the Pengel International Airport, this system will provide a complete Air Traffic Management (ATM) system that is fully dedicated to the civil aviation community.
